

## Finding your International Routing and Account Number

Every country handles account numbers differently. For this reason, we've created this document to help find your international routing number. In most cases, you can find this number by looking at the bottom of your checks. If not, please contact your bank to find out what your international routing number is.

Below is a table of what banks normally call their international routing number in their respective countries, along with the maximum lengths for both fields and the estimated amount of time it will take the money to arrive using International ACH.
